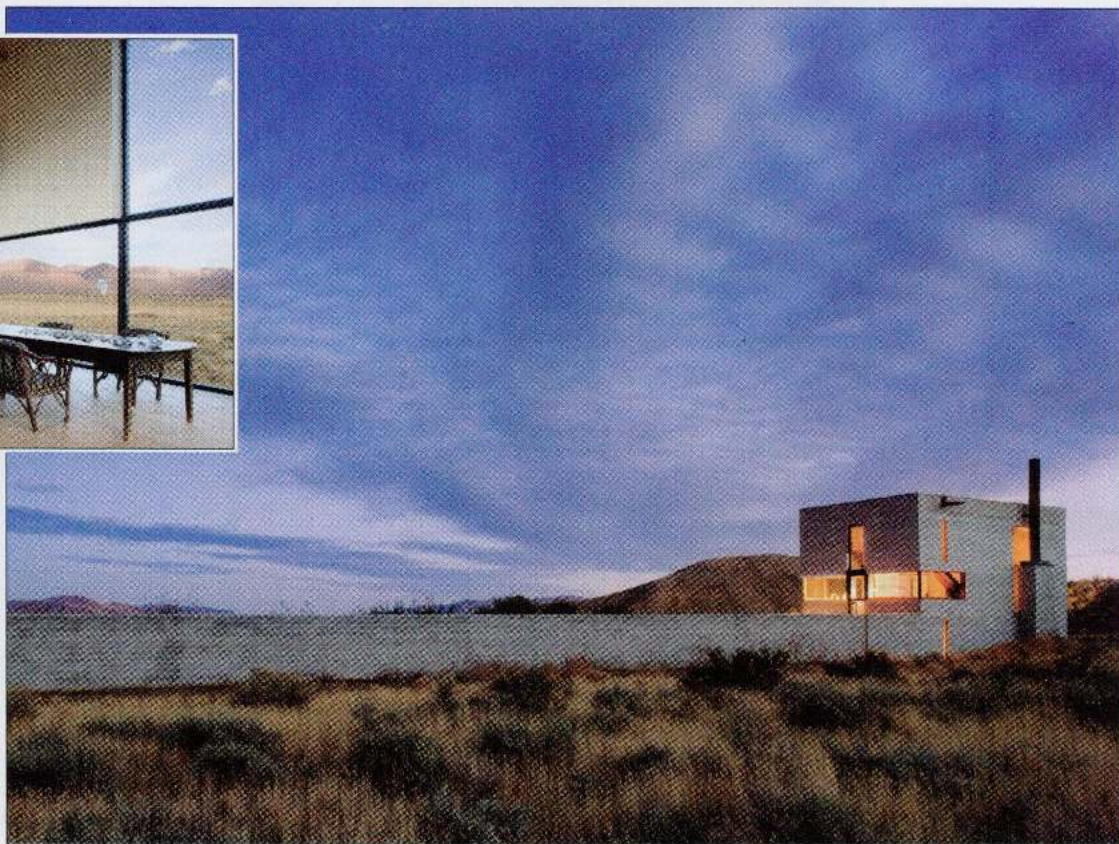

## This week: Unusual one-bedroom homes



**1 ▲ Bellevue, Idaho** Set on 20 acres, this 2,760-square-foot home has been featured in *The New York Times* and other major publications. The house, designed by architect Tom Kundig, features an open floor plan and glass walls that provide panoramic views across the desert to the Pioneer Mountains. \$3,500,000. **2 ▲ Telluride, Colo.** Located near the top of the Telluride Ski Resort, this log-and-stone cabin was originally the developer's home. The house has a stone fireplace, a breakfast bar, and a loft, and sits on three contiguous lots that all have development rights for larger homes. The property includes a creek and a pond, and offers views of the San Sophia Mountains. \$9,500,000. Bill Blueher, Peaks Real Estate/Sotheby's International Realty, (970) 729-1729

**3 ► Shelter Island, N.Y.** Built in the early 1940s, this shingled cottage sits on property that features fruit trees, water views, a rustic stone grill, and a dining pavilion. Interior details include custom-designed light fixtures, double-hung Dutch shutters, clerestory windows, and ceramic tile floors. \$850,000. Peter McCracken, Corcoran Group, (631) 774-0107





**4 ▲ Mill Valley, Calif.** Tucked away on a hidden lot off a private road, this cottage has recently undergone a complete redesign. New additions include hardwood maple floors from a 1920s San Francisco post office, cement countertops, and a reclaimed cast iron tub. \$850,000. **5 ▲ Livingston, Mont.** This 1,100-square-foot cabin is located on 25 fenced-in acres abutting state land. The home is fully furnished and features two native-rock fireplaces and a wraparound porch with panoramic views. The home is off the grid, utilizing both solar panels and wind generators. \$360,000. **6 ▲ Baileys Harbor, Wis.** The contemporary modular residence above is part of a three-building complex designed by architect Steven Wadzinski. The 7.5-acre property is located on Door Peninsula, near Kangaroo Lake, and the refurbished barn in the background was last used as an event space. \$499,000. **7 ▲ Tres Piedras, N.M.** Built in 2007 on a 160-acre site, this "earthship"-style home features flagstone floors, tongue-and-groove ceilings, passive climate control, off-the-grid electric power, and an integrated greenhouse with a built-in gray-water planter.
